



1. MATT PLATKIN



After serving in an acting capacity for most of 2022, now-Attorney General Platkin was confirmed by the Senate in September, following his nomination by Governor Phil Murphy. An early member of the Governor's campaign team and inner circle from the early days of the 2017 campaign, Platkin, in his mid-thirties, became one of the Governor's most-trusted legal advisors and served as Chief Counsel before departing for the private sector. Platkin re-entered the realm of public service upon his appointment as Acting Attorney General – and nomination and subsequent confirmation – giving Platkin the distinction of becoming the youngest Attorney General in New Jersey history, as well as being among the youngest in the nation at the present time. As the top law enforcement official in the state, Platkin wields tremendous influence in shaping the implementation of a wide range of policies affecting the entire population, among them: criminal justice reform, social justice, gun violence prevention.



2. ANDY KIM



Seeking his third term in the general election this year, Kim is still a relatively young Congressmember nationwide and is the youngest in New Jersey, and is uniquely positioned to be a champion for youth issues statewide and nationwide. First elected by a narrow margin in 2018 in the 'blue wave' election, defeating incumbent Tom MacArthur, Kim is facing stronger headwinds this year, as he faces a challenge from Republican candidate Bob Healey – also a young candidate, making the CD3 matchup the only congressional contest in the state between two between two millennial candidates.







8. BOB HEALEY



The former punk rocker and yacht-builder defeated Ian Smith in the GOP primary earlier this year for the right to take on incumbent Democratic Rep. Kim in the 3rd District. Healey, in his late 30s, is among the younger generation of Republican congressional candidates nationwide this year, and his campaign is on the radar of the NRCC and other national organizations. The Healey v. Kim matchup gives New Jersey its only congressional contest between two millennial candidates.



He survived a close contest last year in which the Republicans swept the two Assembly seats, proving his ability to navigate choppy political terrain.



10. SARAH NEIBART



The Mendham Township Committeewoman, who had previously served as mayor, ran earlier this year for Morris County Commissioner in one of the most contentious county Republican primary races in memory, ultimately coming short of defeating the incumbent. Despite a scorched-earth campaign being run against her, she came within 1,000 votes of securing the nomination.



11. BRANDON UMBA

The former Lumberton business administrator ran, and won, for Assembly last year with Michael Torrissi and Jean Stanfield in the battleground LD8. Umba's election to the Assembly represents the continuation of younger Burlington County Republicans representing the district, following in the footsteps of former Assemblyman Ryan Peters and Assemblywoman Maria Rodriguez-Gregg.




12. STEPHANIE LAGOS

First Lady Tammy Murphy's Chief of Staff is an influential voice in Trenton and around the state, and earlier this year served as the youngest member of the state's Congressional Redistricting Commission, helping to shape the congressional districts for the next decade.



13. JUSTIN MUSELLA

The Parsippany Republican is an avid campaigner, and his skills and dedication delivered him a Republican primary victory for council last year and subsequent general election victory in a Morris County town that had been trending Democratic in recent years. His work and campaign ethic has caught the attention of NJGOP bigwigs, who continue to headline fundraisers for Musella.




14. TONY PERRY

Having won re-election last year by a 2-to-1 margin, and securing a fourth year as Middletown Mayor, and among his priorities this year has been to create a 'Next Generation Support Program' for students post-COVID. The former Chief of Staff to former Senator Kyrillos is a rising star in statewide Republican circles, and would be a formidable candidate for higher office in the future.



15. ASHLEY FELICE

A rising star in Republican circles, Felice was selected as mayor of Chatham Township earlier this year, returning the government to Republican control after Democrats had made in-roads there.



16. NOHEMI SORIA-PEREZ

The Camden native serves as Chief of Staff to the LD5 legislators and won election to the council last year. A first-generation Mexican-American and the first to serve on the city council, she is an advocate for the city's Latino community and a founding member of the 'Campaign For Great Camden Schools'.



























17. MIKE CRISPI

The podcast host, who once ran for Morris County freeholder, primaried veteran Republican Congressman Smith earlier this year, and had allies of former President Trump in his corner, including Roger Stone. Crispi ran county candidates alongside him on the 'America First' slogan, exhibiting no fear in taking on the Republican establishment in the district. While he came up short in the primary against an entrenched incumbent, Crispi says he plans to run again in 2024.



18. SADAF JAFFER

The former Montgomery Township Mayor was elected in battleground 16th Legislative District in 2021, becoming one of the youngest legislators in the Assembly and its first South Asian woman in the Legislature.



19. SAM JOSHI

Having won a hard-fought Democratic primary and general election last year, Joshi took the helm as Mayor of Edison in January. Joshi has made it a priority to work towards bridging the generational divide in the state's fifth largest municipality as well as encouraging youth to become involved in public service.



20. MATT ANDERSON

The Monmouth-based operative recently joined Hoboken Strategy Group, and is the founder of Millennials For NJ, along with board members Rebecca Schwartz, Matt Clarkin, Kaylee McGuire, and Juan Carlos Nordelo. The bipartisan PAC, launched several years ago, continues to boost and raise money and support for young candidates, both Republicans and Democrats.



21. MICHAEL DELAMATER

The respected operative and former Intergovernmental Affairs Director for the Governor's Office won the Morris County Democratic Vice Chairmanship earlier this year, alongside new Chairwoman Amalia Duarte, and is a key player in Morris County, and statewide, politics.



22. ZACHARY DOUGHERTY

The Monmouth County native and college student has been a leader on anti-gun violence initiatives and this year spearheaded a legislative effort to establish the NJ Legislative Youth Council. Dougherty says to his fellow students, "if you're crazy enough to think you can change the world, you're exactly who the world needs'

A rising star, the Somerset County Republican nearly won a commissioner seat in last year's razor-thin county commissioner's race, and is pursuing a commissioner seat again this year.




24. PARIMAL GARG


26. CHIGOZIE ONYEMA


27. KAITLYN WOJTOWIC

28. SAM DEALMEIDA



The Newark Central Ward Councilwoman is the youngest elected official on the city's governing body, and earlier this year was elevated to the role of Council President.








30. TERESA VELARDI

The Monmouth County Republican is a rising operative, and is helming the campaign operations of millennial Republican Bob Healey's campaign in the battleground 3rd Congressional District.




31. AMOL SINHA


33. CRISTINA PINZON

A veteran of statewide politics, campaigns, and media, the founder of Stateside Affairs and her team have continued to earn accolades for their work, specifically with the Latinx political community.




34. JOHN ISEMANN


35. JOHN FRANCIS ROMAN


36. ALYSSA KAYE DAWSON


37. PHIL SWIBINSKI


The Vision Media President is one of the top sought-after Democratic operatives in the state, handling communications for the state party and candidates and elected officials.


39. INTASHAN CHOWDHURY

Currently the Deputy Mayor of Mount Laurel alongside Mayor Pritchett, Steglik last year served as mayor, the youngest in the town's history.




42. MICHAEL SULEIMAN


43. ANDREW TRENK



The Jersey City Ward C Councilman beat back a strong challenge from Team Fulop in last year's election, and has been an independent-minded and vocal advocate on the city's governing body.




50. MARIA DEL CID KOSSO

54. STEPHANY KIM-CHOHAN

The Highland Park Councilwoman was first elected in 2018, and has advocated for increased millennial engagement at the local level.



The Bayonne longshoreman was elected to the Assembly in the 31st Legislative District last year, and is one of the Legislature's youngest members.






65. JOSEPH SIGNORELLO






72. BILLY PREMPEH
